AT HOME YOU CAN...

Activate prior knowledge by asking:

- What happened last time we read this?
- What do you know about this topic?
- What happened last chapter?
- What have you learnt about... at school?
- Do you remember when we found out about...?

Consolidate in real time by asking:

- What do we (now) learn about....?
- How does the writer present....?
- How does this link to what we already know?
- How does ... link to what we already know about...?

Summarise and make predictions by asking:

- What do you want/ expect to happen next?
- Is there anything that we are still waiting to find out?
- Was there anything that surprised or interested you?

IN COLLEGE WE WILL...

Establish purpose and interest by:

- Asking questions about the text.
- Activating prior knowledge.
- Making predictions.

Build interest and support comprehension by:

- Reading aloud with expression.
- Pausing after chunks of information to allow processing.
- Re-read important/ difficult passages.

Consolidate and commit to memory by:

- Checking understanding through questioning.
- Summarising the text and devising mental models
- Revisiting predictions and generating further questions
