*We are very excited to announce that we have forged a new partnership with a secondary school in Kenya—Kibomet.*

When offered the chance to participate in the development of 'school to school' links between Kitale, in the Western region of Kenya and West Sussex primary and secondary schools, we didn't hesitate. Assistant Principal, Miss Kilpatrick who specialises in Geography and has in the past enjoyed work in Africa, was the ideal candidate to represent MRC, able to bring a great deal of experience and local knowledge to the project.

### **Miss Kilpatrick takes up the story**

"I was one of a small group of teachers representing Sussex schools lucky enough to visit Kenya in February, to spend time in potential partner schools wishing to develop curriculum links and agree ways of working. The idea is not just that we will have the chance to get to know the communities of one another, but also that we will work together to share ideas, develop joint projects with staff and students and build a strong relationship between their lives and ours. It's about discovering the things we have in common as well as exploring the differences!" *contd/2*

### **Capt Mark Kelly, Commander of space shuttle Endeavour**

*"...there are a lot of very satisfying moments, but the most exciting is lift-off. There's plenty of risk and it's pretty intense when you're loaded with 500,000 gallons of fuel. We go from zero to 17,500mph in 8mins 20 secs...In the evening I have time for reflection...peering back at Earth...you see the atmosphere is very thin. It looks so fragile...and that makes me consider what we're doing to our planet..."*

## Key contact in Kenya for MRC contd/



"Kibomet Secondary School, Kitale, was just one of the schools we visited, but I have to confess that almost immediately I sensed a synergy, that we already have shared goals and that working together would present enormous benefits to all students and staff involved. I spent 11 hours at Kibomet one day, welcomed by everyone and all eager for us to be involved. Principal, Mr Emmanuel Mukoya and Deputy Mr Moses Luhobe took great pleasure in opening their school to me, from the student led assembly and observing lessons in which students are working up to their Kenya National Examination Council qualifications, to actually taking a couple of sessions myself on the elements of weather. My style was clearly different from what the classes were used to, but they were far too polite to be anything

but charming! There are many similarities between our schools, however, including their foundation which was based on the education of a small number of students only 15, in 1997 (ours was only 12, but in 1692!) and the fact that although numbers are different (300 students as opposed to our 890) they serve a widespread, rural community and are currently in the middle of a new build programme! It's a very exciting project in which I'm hoping every year group will get involved; I will regularly update everyone with progress in the Newsletter and on our website."

# Attendance Matters

The importance of young people attending College with as few breaks as possible needs no emphasis. Unnecessary absences mean children miss out on vital aspects of their education. Attendance is very good at Midhurst Rother College, but if related issues do arise it is always our priority to work closely with parents and carers to resolve them. Everyone is aware that parents and carers are legally responsible for ensuring their child's good attendance, but not necessarily that this is

tracked by West Sussex County Council as well as ourselves and that if attendance is poor a penalty could be imposed. There is now a new 'trigger point' at which a WSCC Fixed Penalty Notice is served – the tenth occasion during any ten week period. Each day counts as two occasions (one in the morning and one in the afternoon).

# Principal

As we reach the end of what has been a long and demanding term, the sun is shining, our students are fully involved in Charities Week and we are heading towards the end of a very successful term for Midhurst Rother College.

Earlier in the term we celebrated some very important early exam results in English and very promising module results for Maths, however I am now also able to share with you the following early results as well:

**Geography** – 88% A\*-C

**ICT** – 85% A\*-C

**Triple Science** – **Biology** 45% A\*/A,  
**Chemistry** 55% A\*/A (of which 41% were A\*)  
**Physics** 32% A\*/A

These results reflect the relentlessness with which we are seeking to improve outcomes for our students. Further early module results are due over the Easter break. Having said this, I believe the best is yet to come in the summer.

As a school, we have an absolute duty to improve student outcomes, however this does not make up the whole child. We believe that the freedom to make a contribution is equally as important as a sense of achievement or one of belonging. To this end, our Charities Week is proving to be a great success. Our Sixth Form Charity Committee have organised a range of events (*Lip Sync*, an *Acoustic Gig*, *Take Me Out*, a *Super Heroes Dress-up Day*, a *Sponge the Teacher* event and an *Own Clothes Day*). The money being raised is going to good causes close to our students' hearts; Help for Heroes, The Chichester Foyer and Chestnut Tree House. There is a strong link between a sense of strong community and a happy and successful school. Year on year our Charities Week has built up momentum and students and staff enter into the spirit of something that makes a big difference to other people's lives.

When I last wrote to you, the River Site Building was in the process of demolition. Since then we have held a very successful Turf Cutting Ceremony and you will have seen from North Street that our new entry road is complete and that blue hoardings are hiding the initial stages of our new building. Over the next few months you will see something different rising from the ground. On the evenings of Tuesday 14 and Thursday 23 June 2011 (from 5.30pm-7.30pm) we are inviting the parents of Rother Valley children in Years 3 to 5 to come to one of two evenings to be hosted in the Midhurst Sports Hall. At these events I and my Senior Leadership Team will be talking about what the next phase of development involves at Midhurst Rother College. There will also be an opportunity to see how the building project is progressing.

Whilst the Easter Holiday is nearly upon us, the College will be open over a number of days for GCSE study and support sessions. This kind of activity involves a strong partnership between students and staff. It is particularly admirable that students are willing to give up holiday time in order to be successful in the summer; a little investment of time now will bring big returns later on.

It only remains for me to say that I hope all our families have a good Easter Holiday. As always, there should be 'downtime', however it should also be a time when students get ready for their summer examinations. They are not far away!
