## A trip of a life time—Vietnam Expedition



*On Sunday 10 July 18 students, 2 True Adventure leaders, Miss Jen weeks and Mrs Jayne Beesley departed from Heathrow bound for Hanoi, Vietnam via Hong Kong - 6th Formers Leah Russell and Lauren Gilson (Head Girl) reporting...*

After a mammoth flight, we were met in Hanoi by Thoi our guide and travelled into the old city, the last part by foot, walking through the very narrow streets in the pouring rain. Following two days of acclimatisation, a 6 hour minibus journey took us into the jungle for the start of our 9 day trek. We walked from village to village carrying our massive packs, enjoying the local food, customs and amazing scenery. Despite the many ups and downs of this adventure (we know just what you mean Mr Neville - see page 5!) we managed to make it to the project village, Phu Mau in the Mai Chau Region, but only after the final and unforgettable challenge of negotiating the perilous pathways of 'Death Mountain'!

The warm welcome of the villagers made it all worthwhile and we felt part of the big family in no time at all. Our mission was to help build a much needed bridge to connect two communities.

It was an enormous task, but we persevered, the experience made easier by our beautiful

surroundings. Mission accomplished we were sad to leave our hosts who threw a wonderful last night party to send us on our way.

During the following two weeks we covered over 1000 miles between Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City, travelling by overnight train, boat and bus. We visited several historical pagodas and sites such as the Cu Chi tunnels used in the Vietnamese war. In Hoi An we all purchased tailor-made silk dresses and suits, for less than the equivalent of £50. When 8 August, our final day, rolled around, we all had mixed feelings, looking forward to returning to our families and comfy beds, but reluctant to be leaving such a fabulous adventure behind. The one thing we have all been able to bring home, and which carry us into our future, are the friendships we forged and the memories of the undisputed camaraderie which saw us all through.

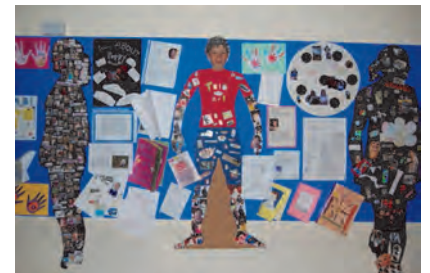

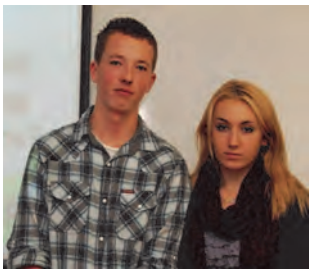

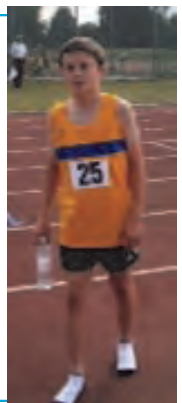
didn't prevent Alex Hooker and Dom Groves putting on a steady stand of over 50. Only 4 wickets fell during the course of the innings.

As I said in my start of term letter, MRC has broken all past records (including those of Midhurst Grammar School) to achieve the best ever GCSE results since this type of examination began in the 1980s. We have improved the 5+ A\*-C GCSE pass rate (including English and Maths) by 11% in comparison to 2010 and the 5+ GCSE A\*-C pass rate by 12%. Not only have we made this step forward *before* going into our new building but we are also delighted for our students knowing they are attending one of the most improved secondary schools in West Sussex.

I fully recognise that nothing stands still in education and to this end MRC has set itself some very ambitious targets for next summer:

90% 5+ GCSE A\*-C  
70% 5+ GCSE A\*-C inc. English & Mathematics  
100% A\*-E at A level  
50% A\*-B at A level

Clearly, these targets are significantly above anything achieved before, however we know that we can make confident steps towards coming as close to these figures as possible.

We have now been working on the 'The MRC Way' for half a term. As you will recall, we are trying to achieving consistency and the highest possible standards in four key areas:

Teaching and Learning  
Assessment  
Behaviour  
Uniform

Getting standards right in these areas will establish the foundation stones for *Phase 2* of MRC's development – the period after our first Section 5 Ofsted inspection but the time before entry to our new building. I believe there is a big difference between consistency (our aim) and conformity (students and staff doing things in a particular way but not fully understanding why). I very much believe in individuality, however it is a trait of the strongest schools that they have agreed and embedded structures and the work on 'The MRC Way' is going to help the College establish these.

In our transition towards greater parental involvement at MRC I have been delighted with the attendance at my first Principal's surgery so I now look forward with real excitement to the first meeting of the new Midhurst Rother College Association (MRCA) on the evening of Thursday 3 November in Memorial Hall at 6.30pm. I really want this to become a powerful parents' group. The big change from the past is that membership is automatic for *all* parents and carers. MRCA's three aims are:

To provide a forum where members can be consulted on current issues or future plans  
To provide a calendar of social events for members  
To raise money for the College

The best schools are those where parents really get involved – the MRCA presents a golden opportunity for this to happen. I have spoken to many parents since starting at MRC in 2009 and I am absolutely confident we have a *wonderful* group of people who want to get closely involved with what is becoming a great success story. I sincerely look forward to seeing as many of you there on the evening of 3 November and discussing with you the many new ideas we want to introduce at MRC. These are truly exciting times.

It only remains for me to say I hope you all have a peaceful half term and I hope our students in Years 10, 11, 12 and 13 take every opportunity to work hard for the examinations that are ahead in November and January of this academic year!

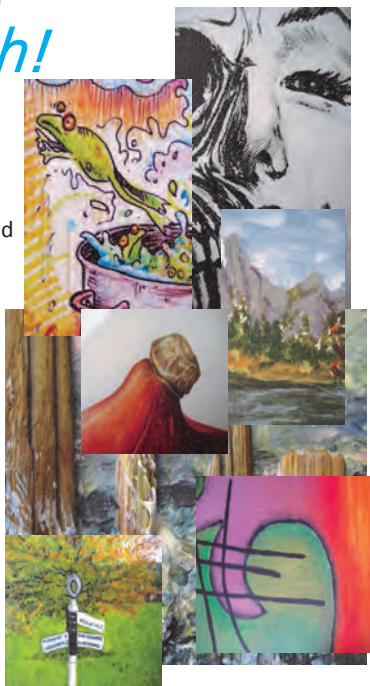
