I'd like to thank the parents / carers who have responded to this and shared their views. I have received comments and questions from around 5% of parents so far – further comments are welcomed. I will send an FAQs in response to questions on 25 November. I have not responded to individual messages, as I want to share information with everyone - individual responses don't permit this. I would like to assure you that all messages have been and will be read.

I'd like to say a big 'well done' to our Year 11 and 13 students for their work and effort in exams. They are working hard and I am sure this will pay off when they get their results. A reminder to parents / carers that KS3 assessments are ongoing.

On Monday this week, we held our annual Remembrance Whole College Assembly. Mr Harris led a short presentation and all the students stood to mark the two-minutes silence as a community, as well as hearing the Last Post. This was incredibly powerful with 1,200 people all in one space paying their respects. Mr Harris told the students that there are very few veterans from World War 2 still alive, which makes it even more important that we make every effort to mark this occasion. Our Sixth Form along with a student representative from each Year Group gathered around the Memorial in the lower hub to lay our wreaths1.

The Last Post was played by students from the Music Dept to mark the begining and end of the silence, which echoed round the college, which was extremley moving.


The team has been formed...the before photos have been taken... let the growing begin! Mr T has made a brilliant start - don't forget to donate!


We Need You!






Get Career Confident




