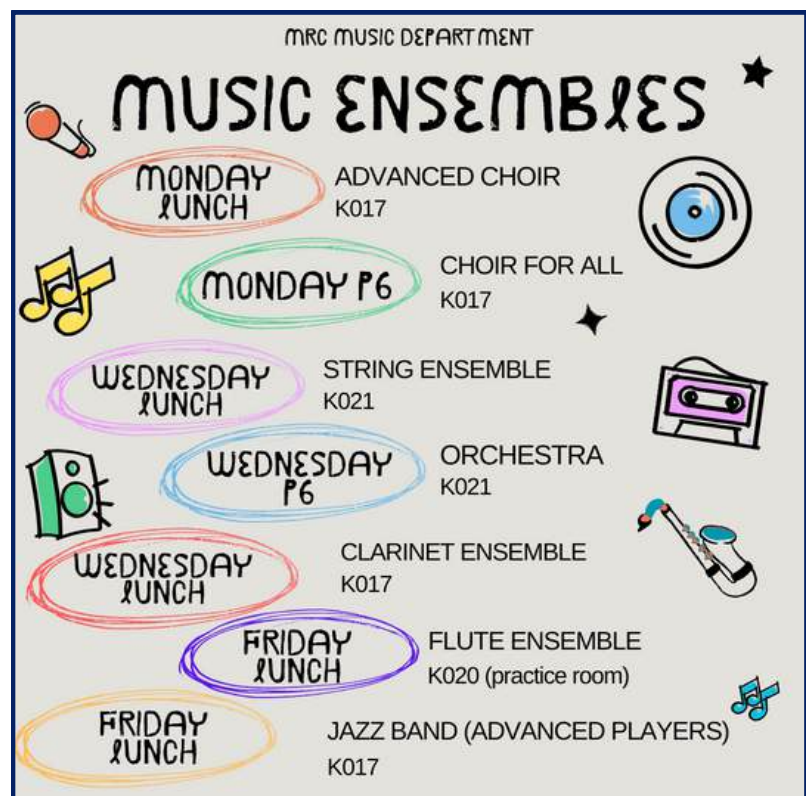

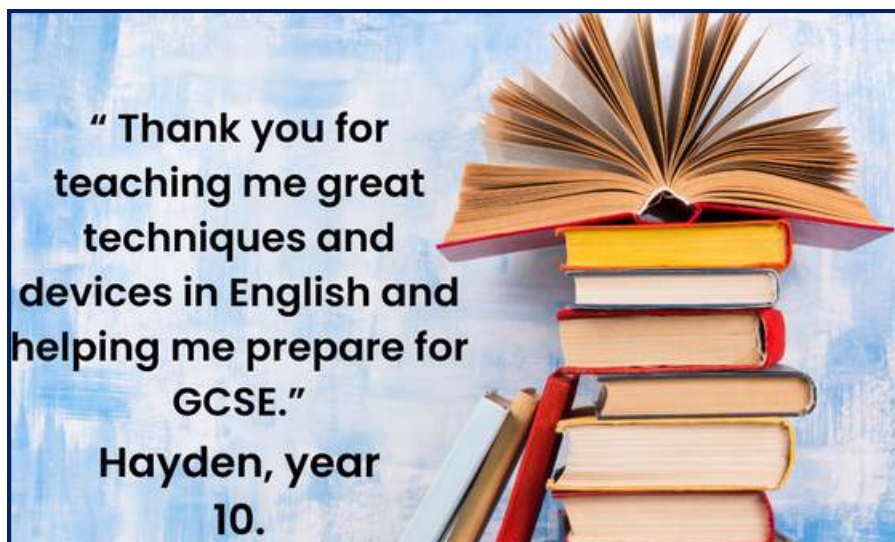
GRAMMAR STREAM

ATLASSIAN WILLIAMS RACING STEM EXPERIENCE

Last Thursday, the 6 March a group of Year 9 and 10 students, had a fantastic opportunity to visit the Atlassian Williams Racing STEM experience. After a long journey, we came into view with the superb facilities and the coach erupted with excitement.

After we got off the coach, we were welcomed by the fantastic group of employees who took us through the brilliant building to our room for the day, Monaco. After that we were taken into the conference room named after Sir Frank Williams, also the only room not named after a Formula One track.

Our first activity we took part in was to learn about crumple zones on the nose of the car and its importance for the car and the driver. With that information we were instructed to design and create our own using materials such as cardboard and polystyrene pellets. Prior to our crash tests we had to adapt our nose cones to perform the best when attached to model wooden chassis to then be trialled in their miniature frontal impact crash test, which was then turned into a competition. Williams gifted the winners of this competition the limited edition Australian Grand Prix Alex Albon race mode caps.

After a short lunch break in Monaco, we were brought to their impressive surrounding theatre, and after a brief video of Atlassian Williams Racing's history, the screen panels opened into their very impressive private Formula One car collection, which was fantastic. This included the Williams BMW FW24 from 2002 driven by Juan Pablo Montoya and Ralf Schumacher and the Williams Renault FW34 driven by Bruno Senna and Pastor Maldonado which he won their only win that season at the 2012 Spanish Grand Prix at Catalunya, their first and latest win to this day. We also got to learn about the carbon fibre seats the drivers use and how they are moulded to fit each driver perfectly along with the carbon fibre side pods used by Alex Albon and the steering wheel and its complexity used by George Russell.

Finally, we were shown their incredible E-Sports racing simulators used by their professional E-Sports racing team. Each simulator had pedals with a braking force of 30Kg and a steering wheel with force feedback to give you a proper feel for how it feels to drive a real Formula One car. We had a mini championship consisting of three races being Australia then Silverstone and then finally Baku, Azerbaijan.

On Friday 14 March a couple of our Sixth Form students will have 'Braved the Shave' in order to raise money for the local Macmillan service.

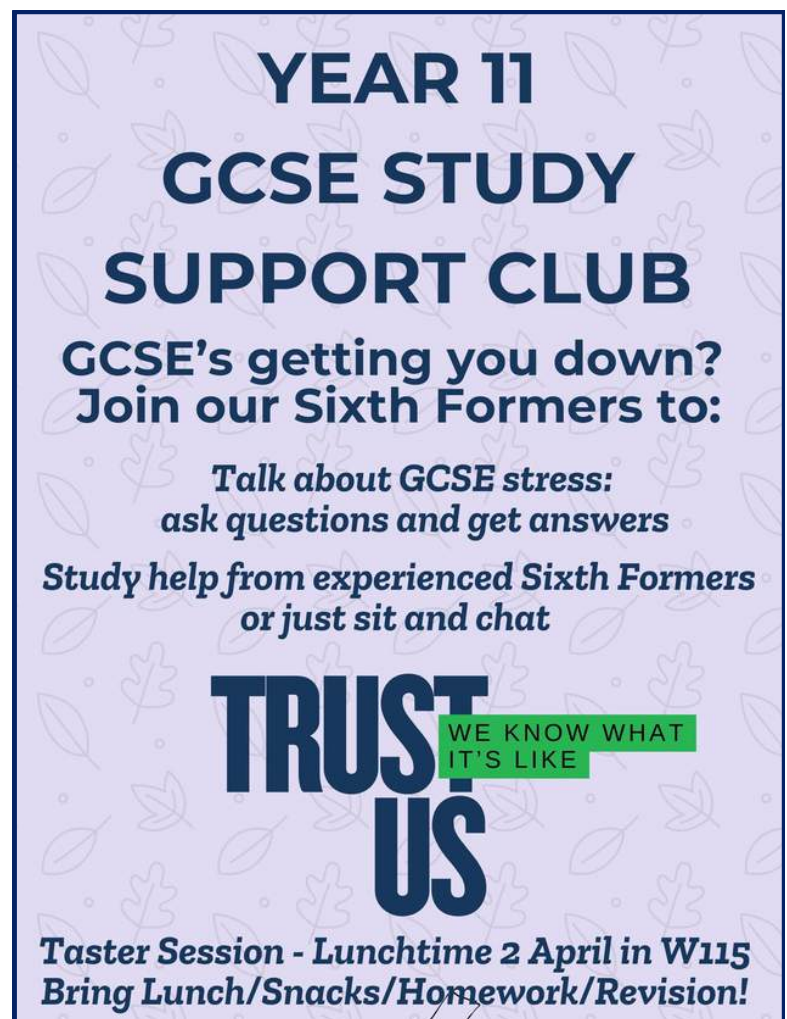

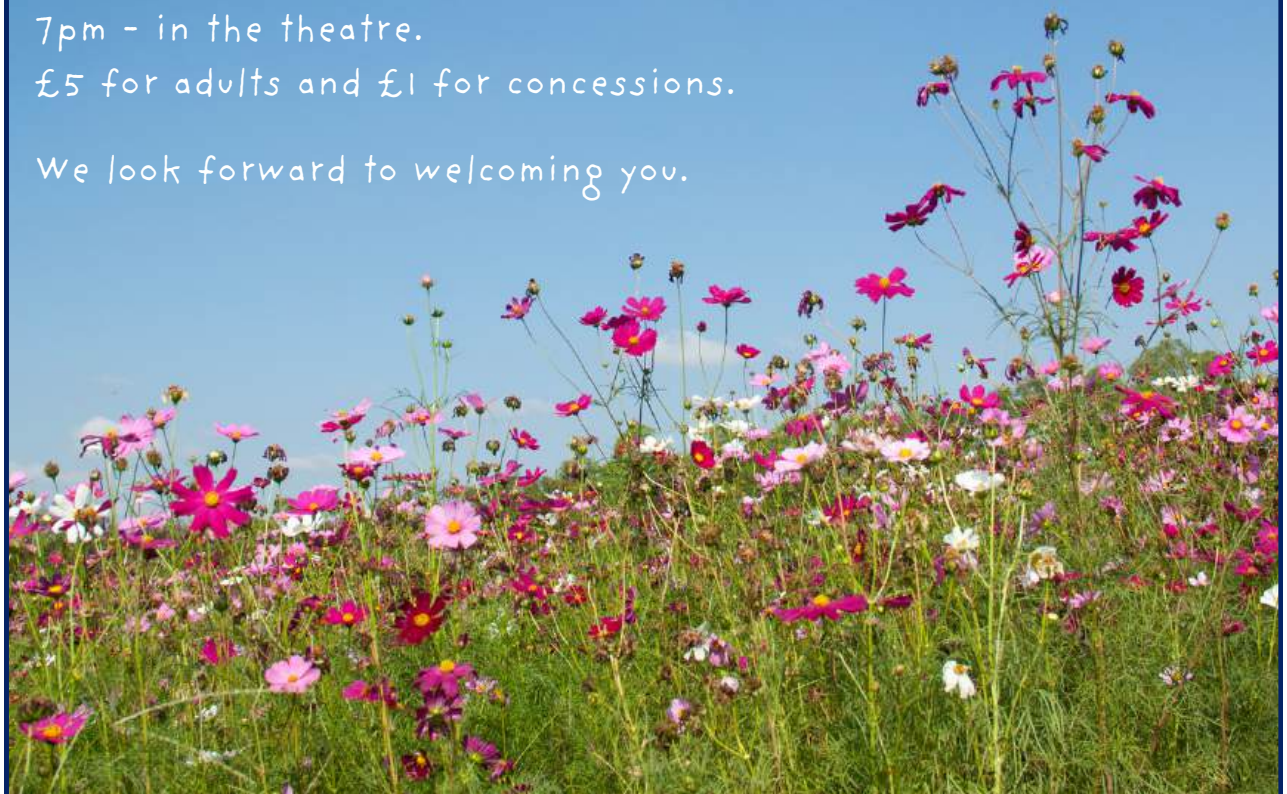

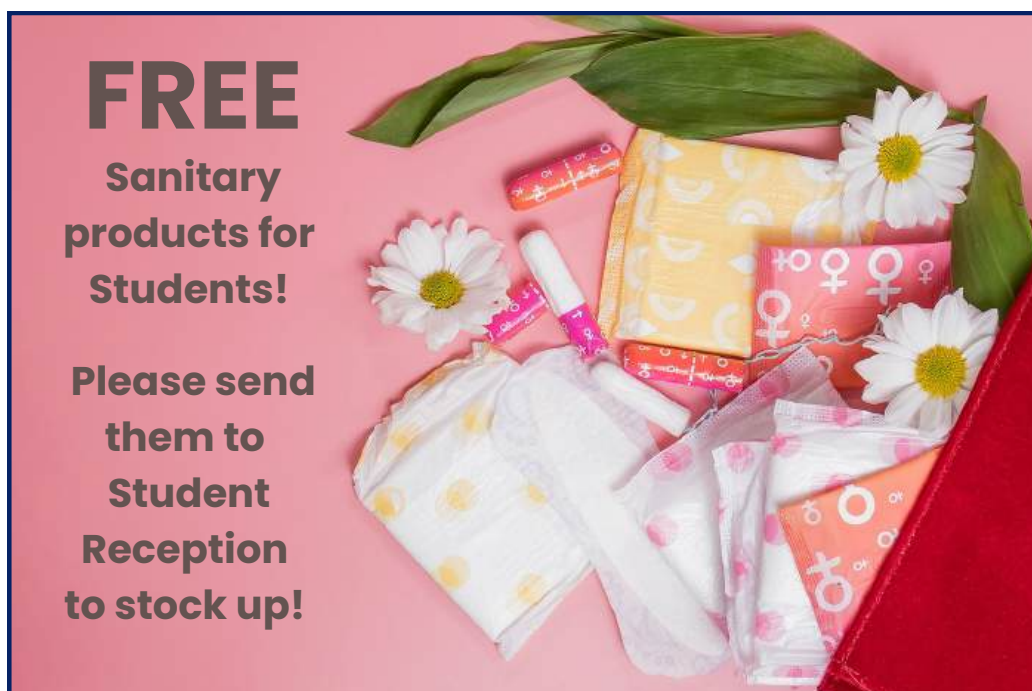


Negative Uniform/Jewellery Points
