ASSESSMENT DIARY AND EXAMS

KS3 & KS4 ASSESSMENT DIARY

Week beginning : 19 May 2025

As we begin the summer term, we approach the final set of assessments in the academic year. Most happen in mid and late June, but some are a little earlier (please see below).

The end of year assessments are an important milestone for students and, as such, we value the support you give to your child to help them prepare for these assessments. This year tutors and teachers have worked with students more on how to revise effectively.

Revising well from Year 7 embeds good study habits, refreshes knowledge, builds confidence and prepares students for greater success at GCSE and beyond. At MRC our approach to revision is "FLAT"; focussed, long-term, and active and transformed. Information from subject teachers helps your child achieve FLAT revision by saying what topics will be tested and what sort of questions will be set. We suggest students look ahead and plan, so they start revising ahead of time to avoid last minute panic or stress. We teach the children some active ways of revising (follow the link on the next page) such as "Lift Pass" and "Snowball".

Finally, we know students need to transform the information or concepts they are revising. This means retelling the learning verbally in their own words and/or creating a mind map or flowchart rather than passive work like copying. Reading over notes or copying them out is less effective as we all tend to get distracted when a task is too easy or dull. Teachers will practice good techniques with students before half term week, and we do encourage parents and carers to help children set aside some time for revision over that week. Thank you in advance for checking Arbor with your son/daughter and even joining in some revision activities with them.

By half-term, class teachers will be sharing details of forthcoming assessments with your child, including the length of assessment, type of questions, topics that will be in the assessment and some revision activities that will be useful to help your child prepare. This will be available on Arbor as an assignment. Additional information and revision guidance can be found on the college website (<https://www.mrc-academy.org/curriculum/revision-resources>) at any time; this page provides useful ideas and strategies to support independent and effective revision by any child at any time.

Experience shows us that students who are well rested, have had a good breakfast and are properly prepared with the right equipment, experience less stress and anxiety before assessments and perform better. We thank you for supporting your child in their preparation.

We are also mindful that these assessments can create a degree of stress and anxiety – please do contact your Head of Year for support and advice should this be the case.

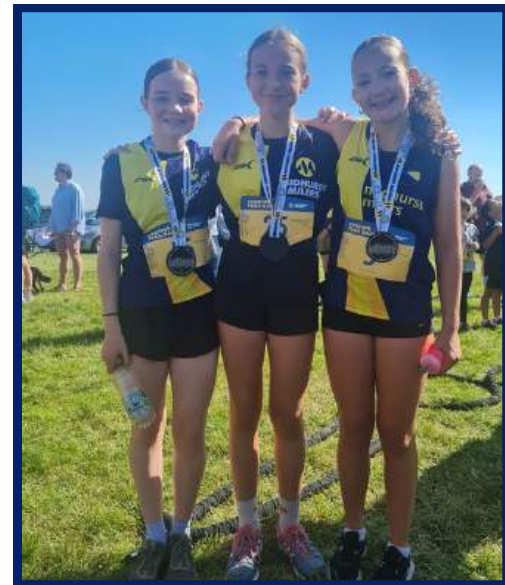

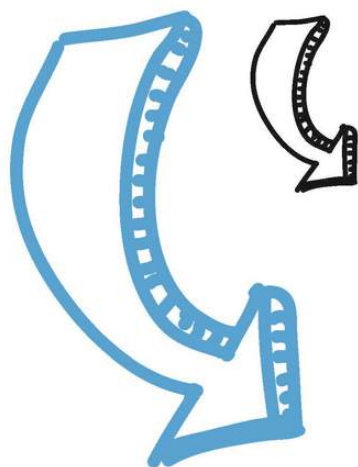
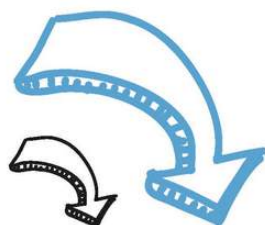

From problem-solving under pressure to working collaboratively in the pits, every young person on the team contributed to this brilliant result.

We are incredibly proud of their hard work, commitment, and the positive way they represented the Centre throughout the weekend. A huge thank you also goes to the staff, volunteers, and supporters who made this experience possible.
