ARBOR HELP & HOMEWORK HELP



Arbor – Homework Portal

All homework set will be listed in the Arbor Student and Parent Portal with links if required to the relevant sites. Students can keep track of what homework they have outstanding by viewing the Assignments that are due. Once they have completed the

homework on the relevant site, they can then return to Arbor and click on the "Mark as submitted" button on that assignment. This will remove it from the "Assignments that are due" section to the "Submitted Assignments".

However, **no homework is submitted via Arbor**, hence if this has been clicked it does not mean the homework has been completed and handed in. This button is just used to help students keep a track of what homework they have outstanding and to do.




