This year, I find myself slowly stumbling towards being able to run a full marathon. If you had told me just a year ago that I'd be lacing up a pair of running shoes and raising money for charity, I'd have called you crazy! Throughout 2025, I'm swapping my classic blue jeans for a pair of running shorts and taking it all run day at a time!

### About Scleroderma and Raynaud's

For most people, when Autumn and Winter hit, they grab a cosy sweater and their favourite hot drink. But for around 10 million people living with Raynaud's in the UK, simple exposure to the cold can trigger painful episodes and numbness. While most of the time this isn't severe, for some it disrupts even the most basic of tasks. Secondary Raynaud's, which is where it is caused by another condition, can sometimes be caused by Scleroderma. This rare autoimmune disease, which affects roughly 19,000 people in the UK, leads to the hardening and tightening of skin and connective tissue, sometimes attacking internal organs like the lungs.

Despite being more common than cystic fibrosis in the UK (11,000), Scleroderma receives far less awareness and research funding.

### So why am I running?

Raynaud's has been in my life since I was in primary school, and watching people close to me struggle with its effects has made me appreciate their daily struggle more and more. Despite around 10 million people in the UK having Raynaud's, a shockingly small proportion of people understand what it is, or even what it's called!

That's why I'm pushing myself far beyond my comfort zone for Scleroderma & Raynaud's UK to change lives with every step. While I may not be the next Steve Jones, I know that every mile I run will be more than worth it to support this incredible charity.

### How can you help?

No matter how small the amount, every penny donated will help fund the only charity in the UK helping patients with Scleroderma and Raynaud's by running awareness campaigns, funding research, and providing help to those living with these conditions.


*Agatha Christie*

This month we are celebrating the best-selling novelist of all time, Agatha Christie, known for her array of crime-fiction, often featuring the legendary Hercule Poirot and Miss Marple. Her first novel, *The Mysterious Affair at Styles*, was written after her sister dared her to, and was rejected six times before it was finally published. In her lifetime she wrote 66 novels as well as other literary works, most of which have been adapted for stage, television and film, such as the play, *The Mousetrap*, which is the longest running play in the world. She once disappeared for 11 days in 1926, during which a frantic police hunt was put in place. She was later found in a hotel under an assumed name!




