PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGES

Welcome to the first Midhurst Matters of this academic year! As a reminder, the newsletter is designed to be relatively informal and provides you with upcoming dates and information about the school.

Our new Year 7 have been with us for just over a week – they already know their way around the school and have settled in well to the MRC community. In assemblies last week with every year group, I reiterated our expectations for the year with students. One of the key areas we are focussing on, as last year, is homework completion. I feel that that homework is an essential part of the learning process. It consolidates learning from lessons and also helps prepare

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students for their examination years by creating good study habits. Most of our homework is online – if your child does not have access to a device, please let Mr Burton know and we can arrange a loan of a chromebook to complete their work.

Last week was the hottest week of the year. We relaxed the uniform because of this but as temperatures have returned to normal all students should now be in full school uniform, including wearing their blazers. I would like to remind parents / carers that the v-neck jumper is optional, but the blazer is not. Students are also not permitted to wear hoodies to school – they will be confiscated and are not part of our uniform.

Thank you to parents / carers who have provided names to my PA, Mrs Banbury, regarding participation in a learning visit to school. This is an opportunity for parents to go on a tour during the school day and see us in action. We have reached our limit for numbers for this half-term – please email sarah.banbury@mrc-academy.org if you would like to participate in a future visit.

In the summer term, I wrote to all parents / carers about year group residential visit opportunities for this year. These are open to Years 7, 9 and 10 this year. Our plan is to repeat the visits each year, so that each child has opportunities to participate in residential(s) should they wish to. Letters will be coming to parents / carers about the visits in the coming days requesting deposits.

Mobile devices are very much part of everyday life, but we must ensure that they do not disrupt learning during the school day. Phones should be "not seen or heard" unless instructed otherwise by a teacher as part of a lesson. Mobile devices being used when they should be out of sight will be confiscated and logged on Arbor, from the third occasion an email will be sent home informing parents that the device will need to be collected by a parent or relative.

Results Day - A Level and GCSE

Sixth Form

Our Sixth Formers confirmed their places at high-quality university destinations, after receiving an excellent set of A Level results. Their hard work was recognised with 40% of A Level entries achieving grades A* - A and 63% achieving grades A*-B. Similarly impressive, in their BTEC studies, 63% of entries achieving Distinction* - Distinction, equivalent to the top A Level grades.

Students also displayed their prowess in STEM subjects with 86% of entries achieving A*-A in Computer Science and 75% of entries achieving A*-A in Mathematics.

GCSE

A stand-out raft of GCSE results was cause for celebration on results day back in August. Pass rates were high at the College this year, with 80% of students achieving a grade 4 or above in both English and maths, and 57% achieving a grade 5 or above in both subjects. Many of our Year 11 students have gone on to take up places in our Sixth Form, where they will undoubtedly continue to make excellent progress.

The class of 2024 have made a great start to the new term. Students have joined new tutor groups and are working hard to address gaps in their learning, attending early morning masterclasses conducted in tutor time by specialist teachers of maths, English, science humanities and languages.

We have been impressed by the courtesy, punctuality, and attendance of the whole year group so far. Such a positive approach to their learning gives us much optimism about how well they can build on strong relationships to cope with the demands of Year 11 and all the exams ahead! It was great to set out the busy Year 11 timeline for so many students and meet parents in person at the recent Information Evening on 12 September. We look forward to working in partnership with this cohort and their families to ensure every student can progress to their chosen courses and future careers next year.
