
Attendance

We would like to start by saying that it has been an absolute joy to see so many students attending College since the start of term and bringing the building to life. The vast majority of students arrive on time and are ready to learn each and every day. This is something that we obviously want to continue, whilst ensuring that every child is safe and accounted for, as we strive to secure attendance levels that match pre-pandemic levels and we need your support to guarantee it happens.

Key Information

Over the past few years, all colleges and schools have faced significant challenges regarding attendance. MRC is no different. Despite being higher than the national average for attendance last year, we did not see enough students on a regular basis. This is a concern to us as losing time in education can significantly impact a child's life chances. Over the years there have been numerous studies on this topic and the findings all seem to reach the same conclusion - a child who attends school or college has the best chance of success both personally and academically. This infographic, which we use weekly with students, gives you an idea as to how precious time in education is.





Did you know that an attendance figure below 90% classifies a child as being persistently absent? Equally, an attendance figure below 80% would mean that a child is severely absent. These are situations that we wish to avoid in order to maximise the potential of every student here at MRC.

The world of attendance also leans heavily into the world of safeguarding, and we uphold the view that attendance is everyone's responsibility, and no child must become a "known unknown" to those responsible for protecting them.

Talk to Us

Talk to us is a phrase that we use with students on a daily basis, helping us to help the children in our care (regardless of the subject matter). We now ask you to do the same and encourage you to get in contact with us if you feel that there are long term issues or barriers that are impacting your child's attendance. Our dedicated team of tutors, Heads of Year and the Attendance Team are here to support you and your children - so, talk to us.

Equally, please ensure that you communicate with us each day for any/all absences. Leave a message for the Attendance team on 01730 812451 (select option 1) or make contact via email: attendance@mrc-academy.org. We work closely with the legislation as laid out in the DfE's Working together to improve school attendance publication to ensure that we fulfil the government's mandate on attendance and support you and your child.

Rewards

As part of our daily and weekly routines, we run attendance competitions between form groups, year groups and the four Houses. By simply attending, your child can contribute to the success of these different groups. In addition to this, and we are very excited to introduce this, individual students can now gain 10 achievement points for each week where their attendance is at 100%. Beyond this, all students whose attendance is at 96% or above by the end of the academic year will be entered into a prize draw and could win cinema vouchers for a year, a bike, or a Nintendo Switch games console.

Thank you for your continued support in relation to all matters related to attendance, and we hope that you agree that attendance really does matter.


