This week we celebrated our annual Gilbert Hannam Day in College. Gilbert Hannam was the founder of a school in Midhurst, which provided a free education for 12 protestant boys. From the original school, which is now part of the Spread Eagle, the school developed and grew into Midhurst Rother College and the 1200 children we have today. It was a real pleasure to go to the Church with the students on Thursday. Their behaviour and conduct was impeccable, the Orchestra played and our Choir sang. The Trustees of the GHEF (Gilbert Hannam Education Foundation) attended the ceremony yesterday too.

The awards event took place last night, where students' successes were acknowledged. The GHEF also give travel bursaries to Sixth Form students and awards for essay prizes. They also give a bursary of £750 to the highest performing GCSE students who stay in our Sixth Form. Outside of the event, the foundation provides support for our College in a variety of ways, such as paying for new computers, new music equipment and contributing to the cost of residential visits. Our students benefit enormously from this charity.

Today is Comic Relief Day and students were able to wear their clothes for a voluntary contribution of £1.00. Various events took place throughout the day to raise money.


STUDENT SPONSORED CYCLE

Hi Everyone






PRIMARY OUTREACH UPDATE

So far this half term we have hosted two primary outreach events, Year 5 Creative English and Year 6 Maths International Pi Day.

18 Year 5 students from the Rother Valley primary schools spent the day in the English department with Mrs Wilkie creating their "Magnificent MRC" newspaper. Interviewing staff and students and visiting lessons, the students wrote about what they'd discovered during their day at MRC and illustrated their work with some fantastic drawings.

Year 6 eager mathematicians spent the afternoon of Friday 14 March with our maths team in the company of Mrs Lawrence and Mrs Bell.









For those who are unaware, 14 March marks International Pi Day, an annual celebration of the mathematical sign Pi. Founded in 1988 by physicist Larry Shaw, March 14 was selected because the numerical date (3.14) represents the first three digits of Pi and it also happens to be Albert Einstein's birthday.

After being firstly wowed by Mrs Lawrence and her maths magic, they then discovered it wasn't magic after all, but maths in action. Mrs Bell and the students investigated the relationship between the circumference and diameter of circles to discover that Pi isn't a random number but is the constant ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter.

They finished the session as secret agents cracking cyphers. Codebreakers need to develop mathematical skills like working backwards, being systematic, and ruling out possibilities in order to crack enemy codes and save the day.

EXTRA CURRICULAR

OXFORD UNIVERSITY TRIP - MARIE CURIOUS, WOMEN IN STEM

Last Tuesday, I accompanied fifteen Year 9 students to Oxford University for Marie Curious, Women in STEM – the trip was for female and non-binary students who take part in the weekly Women* In STEM club at MRC.

A huge thank you to Miss O'Callaghan for organising this opportunity for Year 9 students and to Miss Goodyear for accompanying me on the trip. It was a pleasure to spend time with the students, and I know on behalf of all of us, this was an incredible trip.



We then went onto learning about Astrophysics, we looked at simulations regarding jet streams in supermassive black holes. Following this we looked at Quantum Computers and learnt what is needed to make a Quantum Computer. We had the chance to build our own Laser beam simulation and watched an incredible Science show about Accelerating Particles, learning about CERN. We even got to play with some Liquid Nitrogen!

To the fifteen Year 9 students I took with me, thank you for being passionate about Science, asking questions, getting really involved and making it a thrilling day!



We started with some Chemistry work, mixing chemicals to create a reaction, the aim was to get the reaction as close to 45 seconds as possible. To add to the fun it was Students Vs Teachers! Of course, the students won!







