# PRINCIPAL's MESSAGES

I hope parents/carers enjoyed a good half-term break. This half-term is always very busy with different events – both during and outside the school day. I would like to draw your attention to our Activities Week, which is w/c 10 July. I have been asked by a parent of a student to make you aware of a health risk their child encountered recently whilst swimming in the local river. Recently, a student caught 'Weil's disease' most likely from swallowing some of the water. This student was, and still is, very ill and is now recovering. Leptospirosis is spread in the urine of infected animals – most commonly rats, mice, cows, pigs and dogs. You can get leptospirosis if: soil or freshwater (such as water from a river, canal or lake) that contains infected urine gets in your mouth, eyes or a cut – usually during activities like outdoor swimming etc.
