## **Teaching at Midhurst Rother College**

Teaching is the central to everything at MRC, whether this is lessons in a classroom, or teaching values in assemblies and through the way we do things – it is all about learning. Students have six lessons per day and a slightly shorter day on Friday. Our aim is that all students produce work that is a product of their independent thinking. Our way of teaching follows these principles:

- 1. **High pace and high challenge:** this is in every lesson, every day. Students must be challenged to learn to their full potential.
- 2. **Teach a challenging curriculum:** our curriculum is very challenging and is sequential, which means it gets more difficult in terms of content, skills and knowledge over time.
- 3. Using modelling in lessons: we routinely demonstrate to students how to complete a task, before asking them to do it on their own.
- **4. 3-2-1, then switch to silence:** our lessons are often quiet in nature with students working in silence. They are better able to concentrate in these conditions.
- 5. 'Cold calling' or no hands up: we ask students not to put hands up to answer questions. The teacher can then choose individuals. This helps to keep all students on task.
- 6. Homework: we set all students homework to consolidate and build their knowledge.
