## Principals Message

I will start my messages today by thanking our new Head Boy and Head Girl for introducing themselves to you in the last edition of Midhurst Matters. They have already made an excellent start and I look forward to them doing and leading more over the course of the year.

The government has recently strengthened the guidance on mobile phone use and stated that they have no place in schools (except for a tiny minority of students who have a medical exemption). This has been our view at MRC since we introduced 'not seen or heard' in 2014/15. We cannot have an outright ban at MRC - this would be impractical as many students need to use their phones as bus passes to travel to and from school every day.

Mobile phones have no place in school. I would like to remind parents of our approach to this: students' phones must be switched off and in bags from when they enter the school site to when they leave. If this is not the case, we will ask the student to hand their phone to their Head of Year every morning and collect every evening for a period of six weeks. This means they will be able to use the phone as an e-ticket for bus travel, if needed, but not have it on their person during the day. We do random spot-checks to monitor that phones are off and in bags every day.

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# PRINCIPAL MESSAGE

The impact of this approach is very positive on our students, their interactions with each other and their wellbeing. Students play games at break and lunch and before school, which includes Uno, other card games, board games, reading and chess or draughts. For students who are outside, they play table-tennis, football on the 4G or just talk with each other. It is good to see them being children and playing in this way every day rather than using a device. We must encourage this.

The Year 9 students recently had their options evening. It was good to see so many parents and students attend. Dr Jessop is leading this process this year and the deadline for completion is 13 March. ## KS3 & KS4 ASSESSMENT DIARY

Week beginning : 2 February 2026

At MRC students in KS3 sit two assessments per year, Year 10 sit three and Year 11 sitting more, especially in core subjects, to help preparations for GCSE exams in the summer. These assessments support students to reflect on their progress, provide opportunities to practice and prepare for KS4 GCSE assessments in a 'low stakes' situation, provide teachers with an objective and comprehensive piece of work to judge students progress and an opportunity to report to parents/carers an accurate measure of their child's academic progress. These assessments cannot be 'failed' and simply give us all an indication of progress and attainment in different subjects – for many an encouragement, for a few some motivation to commit to hard work and progress.

Assessments and Parents Evenings are coming up for the following year groups:

- **Year 11:** Internal assessments in the Theatre straight back after half-term (23 February) and in class week beginning 2 March.
- **Year 9:** in class assessments for all subjects (except English, mathematics, science and MFL) this fortnight (until 11 February).
- **Year 8:** in class assessments for all subjects (except English, mathematics, science and MFL) in the fortnight beginning 23 February 2026.
- **Year 7:** Parents Evening on 12 February 2026 (in person).

If they have not already, over the next week or two, class teachers will be sharing details of forthcoming assessments with your child, including the length of assessment, type of questions, topics that will be in the assessment and some revision activities that will be useful to help your child prepare. This will be available on Arbor as an assignment.

Additional information, dates for individual classes / subjects and revision guidance can be found on the college website (<https://www.mrc-academy.org/curriculum/revision-resources>) at any time; this page provides useful ideas and strategies to support independent and effective revision by any child at any time.

Experience shows us that students who are well rested, have had a good breakfast and are properly prepared with the right equipment experience less stress and anxiety before assessments, and perform better. We thank you for supporting your child in their preparation.

We are also mindful that these assessments can create a degree of stress and anxiety. We do not want our students to feel overwhelmed – please do contact your Head of Year for support and advice should this be the case.

# ATTENDANCE

## ATTENDANCE AND EMPLOYMENT

A quick reminder to all parents/carers that school attendance is compulsory. **Students cannot be absent from school for reasons linked to paid/unpaid employment.** Schools can only grant a leave of absence when a student needs to be absent from school with permission. All schools are expected to restrict leaves of absence to the specific circumstances set out in regulation 11 of the School Attendance (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2024. These circumstances are: Taking part in a regulated performance or employment abroad: in line with a licence issued by a local authority or Justice of the Peace or a body of persons approval (BOPA).

Beyond this, no approval can be given and any employment that occurs in school time is illegal. Parents and employers may face legal action as a result of any such action.




Across two dates, 19 January and 23 January, Talk Consent led an assembly for Years 7–9 and delivered targeted workshops for Years 10 and 12. These sessions formed a key part of our ongoing commitment to promoting healthy relationships, respect, and student wellbeing.




