The Year 11 and Year 13 Mock Exam window begins after half-term. All year 11 and year 13 students will sit assessments in all subjects from the 10 November onwards.


All exams are now visible on students' Arbor timetables (skip forward to November), and should be noted in diaries/calendars to aid revision planning.

By the half-term, class teachers will have shared details of forthcoming assessments with your child, including the length of assessment, type of questions, topics that will be in the assessment and some revision activities that will be useful to help your child prepare. This will be available on Arbor as an assignment.

We will also be providing all year 11 students with a set of papers to take home and complete over the half-term break; this is to support students to revise effectively and be familiar with the style and content of exam papers.


Please select whether you are a parent or a venturer (student), you will also be asked to enter your name and your email address along with an expedition ID, this is: MRCKENYA2027




#### **MRS WALLIS**



#### **PAIRED READING**



#### SUSSEX SAFER ROADS PARTNERSHIP ROADSHOW

On Thursday 23 October, students in Years 7, 8, and 11 took part in a powerful and engaging road safety theatre experience delivered by the Sussex Safer Roads Partnership (SSRP). This event was part of our PSHE curriculum and aimed to raise awareness of personal safety and responsible behaviour on the roads.

The SSRP is a collaboration between East Sussex County Council, Brighton and Hove City Council, West Sussex County Council, Sussex Police, National Highways, and local Fire and Rescue Services. Their work focuses on promoting road safety through education and community engagement.



Students in Years 7 and 8 watched "Look Up!", a performance set on the streets of Sussex that encouraged reflection on personal growth and awareness in everyday situations, including being on your phone as you are walking down the road.

Year 11 students experienced "Take a Second", a thought-provoking show featuring real-life scenarios and testimonies from emergency service personnel. The performance explored critical issues such as drink and drug driving, distractions behind the wheel, in-car safety, and the consequences of choices made as passengers and future drivers.

We were also delighted to welcome Councillor Simon Oakley, Chairman of the Communities, Highways and Environment Scrutiny Committee, who joined us for the morning show.

The roadshow was a valuable and impactful experience for our students, helping them to think more deeply about safety, responsibility, and the real world implications of their actions.


Additionally, the outstanding school facilities are used extensively by the school and local community. We have a diverse portfolio of clubs and activities running every evening and during the weekend.
