Archaeology Webinars - Discover what it's like to study Archaeology at Cambridge.

Interested in the human past and want to find out what that means at Cambridge? Do you enjoy history, art, language or science? Join for a series of online webinars with lecturers from the Department of Archaeology. The BA (Hons) Archaeology at Cambridge is made up of four subject

areas: Archaeology, Biological Anthropology, Assyriology and Egyptology.

Each webinar will consist of an introduction to the subject area, a 30-minute taster lecture and a Q&A with a Cambridge academic. Applying to University

Subject and university reviews - as well as talking through your ideas and plans with family, friends, teachers or advisers, you can find other opinions online. Take the time to check what other people thought by visiting the following:

- 1. Get a student viewpoint at <u>Discover Uni</u> perfect for subject and course provider reviews.
- 2. Read uni and college reviews from the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education.
- 3. Check league tables that rank university and colleges. Make sure you check the sources though, as some can be biased. <u>The Guardian, The Times</u>, and <u>The Complete University</u> Guide are some of the more impartial places to look.
- 4. Look at the Office for Student's <u>Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF)</u> ratings on course detail pages in the UCAS <u>search tool</u>. The ratings are based on the quality of teaching, learning, experience, and graduate outcomes at different universities and colleges.

Oxbridge and Medicine

<u>CIMR Reaching Research</u> - On the 28th, 29th and 30th of July 2025 (10am-12pm each day), the Cambridge Institute of Medical Research (CIMR) is running an online event called **Reaching**Research aimed at students in Years 12 and 13 interested in studying medicine, biomedical sciences, biochemistry, biology etc. at university.

Reaching Research will consist of:

- Several talks from biomedical scientists at different stages of their careers.
- A lab experiment carried out in CIMR.
- Information about university admissions.

Speakers include PhD students, research assistants, postdoctoral researchers, and group leaders. Each scientist will discuss their career background, current research topics and advice to students considering careers in science. The event is aimed at students in Y12 and 13 attending state schools, with priority given to students who meet one or more of our additional criteria detailed on our website.
